Dr. Lorraine Godden and Dr. Sandy Youmans Supporting the Work of the Eastern Ontario Partnership for Adult Education



In 2014, following an extensive province-wide consultation process, the Ontario Ministry of Education released a document titled: *Achieving Excellence: A Renewed Vision for Education in Ontario*. As part of the response to the consultation and to the renewed goals, the Ontario Ministry of Education established an Adult Education Strategy that provided designated funding so that regions would establish a collaborative adult education network, conduct an environmental scan and develop a multi-year strategic plan. In eastern region, the Eastern Ontario Staff Development Network (EOSDN) manages and coordinates this work on behalf of the nine English language District School Boards. The Eastern Regional Partnership for Adult Education (ERPAE), formed in June 2016, hired Frank Hummell as Coordinator for the project in October 2016, and through EOSDN, contracted with Dr. Lorraine Godden and Dr. Sandy Youmans to work with the Coordinator to conduct an environmental scan of current adult and continuing education programs offered by each Board in the region and to help create a multi-year Strategic Plan for adult education in the region.
